Many pupils can feel daunted by the prospect of moving from a small and nurturing primary setting, to a secondary school with many hundreds of pupils. But at Tower College we manage this transition through our outstanding pastoral provision, that is widely recognised in the community.



Supporting Academic Achievement



In class tailored support

Our dedicated teachers provide individualised support to ensure that all pupils are challenged at an appropriate level.

This may include additional scaffolding and guidance for independent work, targeted individual or small group intervention activities and extension tasks to stretch and challenge more confident pupils.

In Middle & Upper school, pupils can bring questions/topics they are finding difficult, or wanting to develop, and receive additional support. Sessions take place in Mrs King's classroom at lunchtimes.

Lower School

Identified pupils work with staff to develop an Individual Challenge Plan containing clear targets for the term ahead. They are invited to attend a weekly club which is designed to encourage problem solving, communication and strategic thinking skills through a range of STEM challenges.

Individualised project packs are also provided to be completed at home, linked to the pupils' specific area of strength and expertise.

Middle & Upper

Our Towering Above programme offers pupils the opportunity to review their progress, attendance and effort and discuss any perceived barriers to learning with a mentor.

The meetings will be focused on academic performance and from the meeting, clear, achievable targets will be mutually agreed.

Our History



Only 4 Principals over our 75 years of educational excellence!

Following World War II, during which the school building was used as a hospital, Tower College was founded by Charles and Muriel Oxley. They founded the school based on the principles of providing an independent school that was not just for the privileged few and providing a happy, family environment.

When Tower College first opened, there were 70 pupils, one full time teacher and two part-time. Now, hundreds of children pass through the gates every day.

The school has always been a close-knit 'family' of staff and pupils who all embrace the school's values of 'resilience', 'integrity', 'scholarship' and 'enrichment'. This is evident in the number of pupils who have returned to train or teach here at the school and the staff who send their own children.

In 1948, the same year the NHS was founded, Tower College first opened its doors to boys and girls in the area.


Individual Guided Tours

Prospective parents are encouraged to visit the school, by appointment, at any time during the school year and as often as they feel is necessary for their child to feel comfortable. This gives the opportunity for parents to see the rapport between pupils and teachers and experience the happy, busy atmosphere of the school. Upper School pupils guide families around school and the tour is followed by a meeting with an Assistant Principal and the Registrar.

Taster Days and Entrance Exams

For Early Years and Lower school your child will be informally assessed to determine what development plan should be put in place. Applicants to Middle and Upper School will be required to pass a standardised assessment, and pupils in Year 7 will complete an entrance exam in English and Maths. Following registration and age-appropriate assessments, your child can attend 2 taster days at the school.





With our fantastic parking facilities and the ease of accessibility from the M62, we are in a prime location to facilitate the daily transition of your child from home life to school life.

From the East or West

From Manchester or Liverpool take the M62 and exit at Junction 7. Take the exit for the A57 towards Rainhill and turn left down Mill Lane.

From St. Helens

Take the A570 to the M62 Junction 7 roundabout and take the 5th exit for the A57 towards Rainhill and turn left down Mill Lane.

From Widnes

Take the A557 to the M62 Junction 7 roundabout and take the 2nd exit for the A57 towards Rainhill and turn left down Mill Lane.

From Warrington

Take the A57 or take the M62 to Junction 7 and take the exit for the A57 towards Rainhill and turn left down Mill Lane.
