# 1. Welcome & Introductions

AB opened the meeting with introductions.

# 2. Year Group Feedback

Year 1 (AL)

Advance notice of events: Parents would like at least one month's overview to allow planning.

Communication channels: Currently split between Parentmail and email; lack of consistency makes it hard to track. Suggestion: one platform and clearer guidance on when responses are required.

Homework: Felt overwhelming this week. Request for clearer guidelines on time expectations.

House points and certificates: Unclear at the start; parents would like information on systems to engage at home.

Reading records: Suggestion for booklets rather than slips to track progress across the year.

> AB Response: Will review communication systems and consider consolidation.

Year 2 (SY)

Uniform: Concerns over PE kit quality, sizing, and availability. Parents support a possible change.

NA noted: Top of the Class (TOTC) uniforms are better quality. PE kit appearance matters when representing the school.

KS1 SATs: Parents queried whether these would take place.

AB confirmed: No, the school does not do KS1 SATs.

Year 3 (EH)

Advance notice of events: As with Y1, request for monthly overviews.

No other concerns raised.

---

Year 4 (VH)

Event follow-up: A parent reported no feedback after the Ice Cream Farm event.

Facilities: Spiders reported in girls' toilets.

Supervision at drop-off: Concerns raised about children waiting at 8.30am

---

Year 5 (HW)

Communications: Same request for earlier notice of events.

After-school clubs: Request for greater variety, more availability, and options for siblings across year groups.

Sports: Suggestion for lower school football and netball teams.

Leadership roles: Query whether prefects/ambassadors will be elected as in previous years.

Uniform: Clarification needed for when girls transition from pinafores to skirts, as uniform shop staff are unclear.

Year 6 (NA)

ISA swimming: Will Mr Williams organise this?

After-school clubs: Too sport-focused; suggestion for alternatives such as science club, choir, or singing. Current violin-only option feels exclusive.

Storage: Bigger bags and equipment require better locker space.

Library: Query on access and status.

AB response: Library still in use, will move upstairs with computers in future.

Parent access to work: Request for appointments or periodic sharing of children's work.

Football club: Query on Thursday after-school football; a parent-coach (with checks completed) is waiting for school's response.
